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4. Woman Empowerment Initiatives through NGO tie-ups

Fr CRCE has established linkages with various bodies like Katalyst, Nimaya etc. These NGO'S play a very vital role towards women empowerment by providing basic education, vocational training, training for self-employment, legal aid, protection for women and self-awareness programs. Thus they are mainly concerned with the upliftment of the women in the society.

Katalyst India - NGO for Women's Empowerment:

Katalyst started a decade ago with the intent of liberating women from low income communities, through the pursuit of professional education. The initiative definitively prepares young women for leadership roles, thereby creating a wider talent pool for India Inc. and helping bridge the gender divide. Katalyst achieves this objective through a blend of unique development interventions, including 600 hour proprietary and scientifically researched curriculum. Over the four years in the program, they provide one-to-one mentorship, access to best in class technology, assistance with internships, and world class industry exposure and corporate interactions.

The primary objectives of the program are:

To enhance employability of the girl students thereby marking their foot prints in the managerial cadre of corporate India.

To encourage and empower talented girls to take on roles of leadership and innovation thus participate in the process of community building.

Selection criteria

Girl students pursuing professional degrees like Engineering, Architecture, Medicine and Chartered Accountancy preferably from colleges of repute with a good academic track record and family income up to Rs. 8 lakhs per year.

The Program supports the girls during their entire undergraduate studies. This includes:

Mentoring: The mentor program offers the students an opportunity to interact with mature, educated individuals from various professional fields who can guide them and expose them to a new set of experiences and perspectives. The mentor program aims at helping Katalysts define themselves, learn essential life skills and evaluate various career options. It is founded on four pillars of support as outlined below

- Socio-emotional Support
- Personality Development
- Academic Support
- Career guidance and support

Life Skill Training: One critical element of the Kalatyst program is to give training in Life Skills and to provide a long term mentor for each student, so that she can develop into a mature, self-confident, all-rounded professional. This will equip Katalyst students to cope with daily living challenges and to attempt to compensate through these sessions, their lack of exposure to situations and experiences required for a successful integration into the corporate world.

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Internship: Katalyst provides its students with assistance in getting internships. Internship gives them exposure to the practical side of what they have learnt so far in the course, and helps validate their decision to do such kind of work in the future. It enhances their hard skills and soft skills. It helps them build network of people to eventually succeed in life. This intervention bridges the gap between academic curriculum and industry. The internship may also lead to a placement offer and culminate into a permanent job.

Filed Visits: Field visits expose Katalyst girls to different industries. It includes floor walks in a factory or a company and provides a better understanding of different processes, functions and departments. The students learn about the foundation of the organization, its structure, and culture. Such exposure visits benefit students by giving a real perspective about their field.

Guest Lectures: Exposure to new experiences and people helps Katalyst girls to learn, get inspired, aspire and act. Katalyst make girls interact with celebrated personalities from various fields. Hearing visionaries from different walks of life acquaints them to a life of a successful person, his/her profession, and various challenges overcome by them. Such talks give girls an inspiration to lead the change in their spheres of influence.

Technical Support: Katalyst gives new laptops to each Katalyst girl at subsidized rates (subsidy up to Rs.25000). It gives girls access to technology, internet and computer programs. In addition, most of the Katalyst girls are pursuing engineering and owning a laptop is a necessity for college assignments and projects.

Medical Insurance: Katalyst provides medical insurance to the student and her mother or female guardian. The daughter is expected to chip in and substitute if mother takes ill affecting studies. This gives access to prompt quality medical treatment and avoids absenteeism or lost study time due to student's or mother's health.

Financial Support: Katalyst gives financial support to its students as incentive (up to Rs.40000 per semester). A scorecard is maintained where each student is given a grade for each of the following parameters:

- 1. Number of hours of training and field visits attended.
- 2. Number of mentor interactions per month.
- 3. General attitude which is based on a rubrics.
- 4. Academic performance in college.

Financial value is assigned for each grade. Thus the amount is calculated and paid every six months.

In 2022-23 3 students got selected for the program.

Nimaya Foundation: "Nimaya" (opportunity in Sanskrit) is a **not for profit** initiative X Billion Skills Lab (XBSL). The aim is to enable girls from under-served backgrounds to build aspirational careers in technology. It is an initiative in partnership with Project Naveli's Navya Nanda, and is supported by the United Nations. The objective of the program is to change & challenge the reality that girls from limiting means, at large, end up capping the scope

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of their career to rote jobs such as admin, secretarial, call centre etc. While no occupation is less dignified, if someone has the potential and ambition to work in aspirational roles as coders or product managers in the booming technology landscape, they should have access to high-quality exposure in 21st century skills such as critical thinking, storytelling, creative problem solving, entrepreneurship and remote collaboration.

These are just as important as technical skills for professional success in the new world of work. In fact the World Economic Forum ranks these **amongst top 10 job skills for jobs** of the future and **India's new national education policy** lays special emphasis on them.

XBSL's goal is to partner with colleges teaching coding / computer science degrees and identify cohorts of qualifying girls to put them through the XBSL 21st century workplace skills development program along with sessions on personality development, grooming and confidence building.

This experience will give a unique edge in placements, where XBSL will also provide support. In fact, senior women leaders from Tech Mahindra will mentor students as part of this cohort. XBSL URL:- https://xbillionskillslab.com/
